<p>The appreciation and enjoyment of the visual arts enriches all our lives and is entwined in our culture. At Newton Bluecoat School we aim to inspire and foster a deep love of art and design. Art gives children unique opportunities to express themselves and a method of recording their ideas and making choices in a creative way.</p> <p>Our teaching of Art enables children to gain a knowledge and understanding of Art and craft in our everyday lives. Through learning about the role and functions of Art and Design, they can explore the impact it has had on contemporary life and that of different times and cultures.</p> <p>We aim to inspire children's curiosity by using visual, tactile and sensory experiences to learn new skills and make creative decisions.</p>	<p>We strive to foster high quality learning opportunities across the arts for our children, both inside and outside the classroom. We try to show children that art is about more than drawing and painting by letting them experience different materials and processes and by exploring the work of historical and modern artists and crafts people.</p> <p>Art is the perfect vehicle to provide cross curricular enrichment so we link some of our art projects to the topics from the Lancashire County Council Scheme of work. Alongside this we follow the Lancashire guidance for the progression of skills in drawing, painting, textiles, sculpture and ICT. We encourage the use of sketchbooks as a starting point to record ideas, investigate the work of artists and try new skills. The children will then apply their skills and ideas using a range of medium and scales.</p> <p>We provide opportunities to learn traditional craft skills through extra – curricular clubs such as knitting, sewing</p>	<p>The impact for our children is that they are equipped with the skills and knowledge to continue exploring and enjoying Art and Design into KS3 and adulthood.</p> <p>During the lesson, children's work is assessed through discussion, with the teacher giving guidance and advice. Children might be paired with a support buddy where new skills are being learnt and this helps to support our SEND children. The children continually self - assess. Work in progress and completed work is shared with peers and regularly displayed, showing the children how their creative choices are important by sharing with peers, other classes and parents.</p>
