

Key Vocabulary Overview

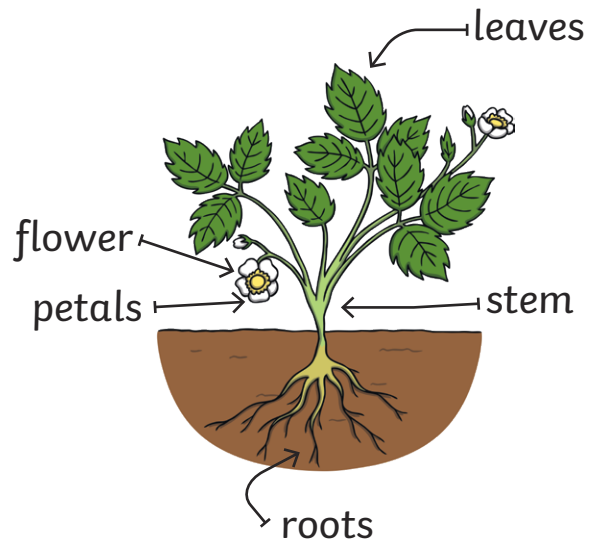
flower	plant part usually at the end of a stem
petal	part of a flower
leaf	flat plant part, usually green
stem	plant part above the soil
roots	plant part usually in the soil
tree	a type of plant
trunk	main stem of a tree
branch	part of a tree that grows from the trunk
fruit	part of a plant that contains seeds
wildflower	plants that grow where the seed falls
daisy	a type of wildflower with a white and yellow flowerhead
garden plant	a type of plant that is looked after by humans

sunflower	a type of garden plant with a large, yellow flowerhead
nettle	a plant that can sting
buttercup	plant with a small, yellow flower
dandelion	plant that has yellow flowers and long leaves

deciduous tree	trees that lose their leaves during autumn/winter
horse chestnut	deciduous tree with 'leaflets'
English oak	deciduous tree with wavy leaves
sycamore	deciduous tree with large, toothed leaves

evergreen tree	trees that do not lose their leaves during autumn/winter
pine	a type of evergreen tree
holly	a type of evergreen tree
needles	hard, thin leaves

Wild Plants

Wildflowers are wild plants that grow where the seed falls.

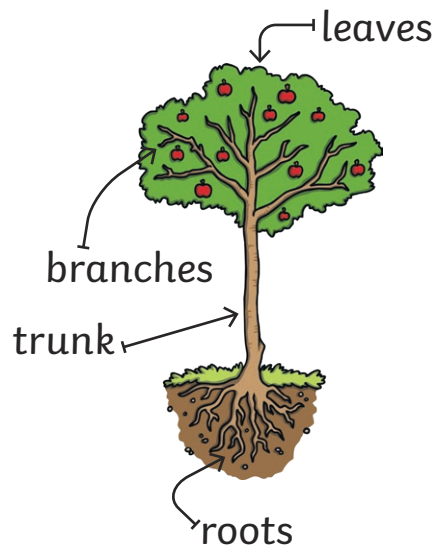

Evergreen Trees

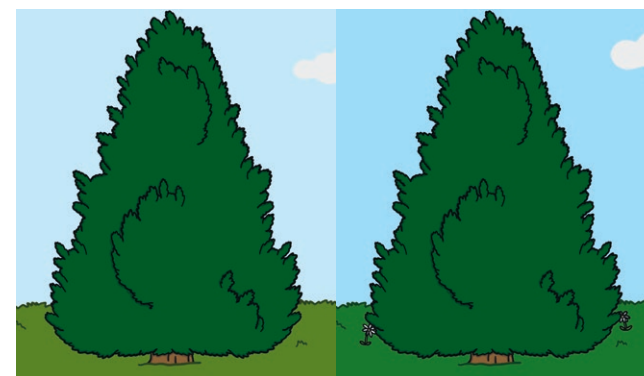
Evergreen trees do not lose their **leaves** during autumn and winter.
